English Comprehension

- Students read, view and comprehend simple informative texts.
- Identify literal meaning and explain inferred meaning.
- Describe how texts are structured and
- Describe the language features of texts.
- Students create a written and multimodal informative text based on a sea animal.
- They use paragraphs, language features, topic-specific vocabulary and visual features throughout the text.

Number and Algebra

- Use additive strategies to solve problems.




2025 School Priorities
