Under this agreement for 2019
Queens Beach State School will receive

\$268,387

This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students' achieving a 'C' or better in English and Mathematics to 85%.
- Improve teacher capability in the teaching of reading, purposeful use of data and Visible Learning.
- Improve the effectiveness of teaching teams through delivery of quality professional development and increased opportunities for cohorts to plan, assess and moderate together.
- Provide increased opportunities for students with disabilities to access educational programs.
- Increase the percentage of students who reach National Minimum Standard (NMS) in Years 3 and 5 to 100%.
- Improve identification of students to cater for diverse social, cultural and academic needs for all students.
- Improve the percentage of students meeting or exceeding the NAPLAN Upper Two Bands (U2B) in Year 3 Reading, to 50%. In year 5 to 40%

Our initiatives include


- Providing regular opportunities for teachers to plan, assess and moderate in cohorts in weekly planning sessions.
- Growing a coaching and feedback culture within our school.
- Provide targeted professional development and coaching to deepen teacher's understandings of the Australian Curriculum.
- Building teacher capacity through tailored professional development focussing on guided reading, unpacking Australian Curriculum, Explicit Instruction, Developing a Growth Mindset and data analysis.
- Providing high quality, focused professional development opportunities for non-teaching staff with particular emphasis on guided reading, working with students with disabilities and explicit teaching of reading comprehension strategies.
- Alignment of support mechanisms, teaching, assessment and reporting for all students.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Purchasing of additional teacher time (Leader of Learning) to support curriculum clarity and implementation of Australian Curriculum (\$88,120)
- Purchasing additional time for full time Deputy to support with student learning and wellbeing (\$46,133)
- Purchasing an additional teacher to support students access to the National Curriculum (\$84,126)
- Releasing staff to participate in data analysis, planning and moderation (\$10,647)
- Purchasing additional Guidance Officer time to support diverse learners accessing curriculum (\$31,202)
- Employing additional teacher aide support (\$8,159)
