**Under this agreement for 2018
Queens Beach State School will receive**

\$228,141

This funding will be used to

- Improve teacher capability, capability in the teaching of reading, purposeful use of data and Explicit Instruction.
- Improve the effectiveness of teaching teams through delivery of quality professional development and increased opportunities for cohorts to plan, assess and moderate together.
- Provide increased opportunities for students with disabilities to access educational programs.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'C' or better in English and Mathematics to 85%.
- Increase the percentage of students who meet National Minimum Standard (NMS) in Years 3 and 5 to 100%.
- Improve the percentage of students achieving results in the NAPLAN Upper Two Bands (U2B) in Year 3 Reading, to 51%.

Our initiatives include

- Providing regular opportunities for teachers to plan, assess and moderate in cohorts
- Providing regular opportunities for cohorts to meet with Leaders of Learning to analyse and discuss student data.
- Growing a coaching and feedback culture within our school.
- Building teacher capacity through tailored professional development focussing on guided reading, unpacking Australian Curriculum, Explicit Instruction, developing a Growth Mindset and data analysis.
- Providing high quality, focused professional development opportunities for non-teaching staff with particular emphasis on guided reading, working with students with disabilities and explicit teaching of reading comprehension strategies.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Purchasing of additional teacher time (Leader of Learning) to support curriculum clarity and implementation of Australian Curriculum (\$33,000)
- Purchasing an additional teacher to support students' access to the National Curriculum (\$70,000)
- Releasing staff to participate in data analysis, planning and moderation (\$40,141)
- Employing and continuing to provide professional development to teacher aides to support students access the National Curriculum (\$48,000)
- Employing additional teacher aide support in the Early Years to support Early Intervention (\$37,000)
